

## **Tennessee Foreclosure Trends: 2011**

## How many/where/patterns

According to the latest data from the RealtyTrac® *US Foreclosure Market Report*, Tennessee reported 26,161 properties with foreclosure filings in 2011, a 33 percent decline from 2010 and a 36 percent decline from 2009.

The total number of properties with foreclosure filings in Tennessee accounted for 1.39 percent of the 1,887,777 properties with foreclosure filings in the nation. In terms of total foreclosure filings, the U.S. had a 34 percent decline from 2010 and a decline of 33 percent from 2009.

In Tennessee, there was one foreclosure filing for every 106 housing units. During the year, 1.45 percent of all the U.S. housing units, one in 69, received at least one foreclosure filing, down from 2.23 percent in 2010. There was one foreclosure filing for every 45 housing units in 2009 in the nation. Total U.S. foreclosure activity and the U.S. foreclosure rate in 2011 were both at their lowest annual level since 2007<sup>1</sup>. The state with the highest foreclosure filing rate in 2011 was Nevada. One in every 16 housing units had foreclosure filings in Nevada, even though the foreclosure activity declined by 31 percent compared to 2010.

The total number of properties with foreclosure filings in four counties (Shelby, Davidson, Knox, and Hamilton) accounted for 46 percent of total foreclosure filings in the state in 2011. Sevier County had the highest foreclosure rate among all counties in Tennessee, with one in every 53 housing units receiving at least one foreclosure filing. In 2011, the county with the highest number of properties with foreclosure filings was Shelby County with 5,688 properties. The number of properties with foreclosure filings in Shelby County declined 46 percent from 10,522 in 2010.

The county with the second highest foreclosure total was Davidson (3,030), followed by Knox County (1,904), and Hamilton County (1,418). The number of properties with foreclosure filings in Davidson, Knox, and Hamilton Counties all declined from 2010, 28 percent, 27 percent, and 31 percent, respectively. Hancock and Pickett Counties both had two properties with foreclosure filings in 2011, followed by Clay (9), and Perry (10) Counties. Eighty-one counties saw a decline in foreclosure filings from 2010 to 2011. Among the counties that had 200 or more properties with foreclosure filings in 2010, Anderson County had the largest annual increase (25 percent), followed by Sullivan County (17 percent). For the counties with 200 or more properties with foreclosure filings, the largest year over year decline was in Shelby County.
